

More than 100,000 eBooks

The Open Library NC project is a collaboration between Internet Archive in San Francisco, California and NC LIVE. Because of this collaboration, all of North Carolina has free borrowing access to a large, shared downloadable eBook collection. The eBooks in this collection are digital scans of books contributed by libraries across the country, including many North Carolina libraries. North Carolina libraries are working with Internet Archive to create one web page for every book every published.




Using Open Library eBooks

1. Visit: www.openlibrary.org.
2. Click "Sign Up" to create a new account. You will need to verify your email address after registering.
3. Login to your account.
4. To view the collection that you can borrow and download, visit the eBook Lending Library at www.openlibrary.org/borrow.
5. Browse or search for a book. *Hint: When searching check the box to "Show only eBooks."



6. Select a book you would like to borrow. If the book is available in eBook format, you will have the option to borrow it. Click "eBook" to borrow the book.



7. You can select to read the book online in your web browser, or download it.
8. If you choose to download the book, you will first need to install the Adobe Digital Editions software (free).



9. Download the book in PDF or ePub format (ePub is commonly used with eReader devices).
10. After downloading, open the book with Adobe Digital Editions. From Adobe Digital Editions you can transfer the book to your portable device.
